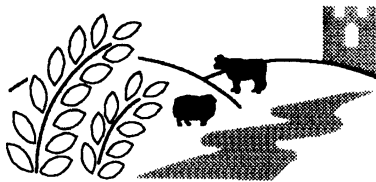

SHOW RULES

- 1.- The Committee of Management shall have power to make By-Laws regulating Entries, Management of Shows, and also other details.
- 2.- All Stock must be bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, and have been in his possession three calendar months previous to the day of the Show, except in Open Classes, and the ages of all animals must be given, where possible, in years, months, weeks and days, reckoned to the 1st August except when stated otherwise, most especially in the entries of young animals of all kinds.
- 3.- If any statement in any entry shall be found to be incorrect such entry shall be cancelled. If any statement shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Committee to be false to the knowledge of the Exhibitor, he shall be disqualified from continuing to be a member of the Society, and shall forfeit all prize money to which he would otherwise be entitled.
- 4.- As the Non-exhibition of Animals entered for the Show causes unnecessary preparations and expense and disarranges the Show Yard, Exhibitors, in default of sending stock after entry, shall pay a fine of £5 to the funds of the Society for each stall or pen of stock omitted to be filled unless satisfactory reasons to be given to the Committee.
- 5.- All disputes shall be settled by the Committee and their decision shall be final.
- 6.- No animal shall be permitted to be decorated in the Show Yard with medals, rosettes, or marks of any previous award, nor shall any notices of previous Prizes be exhibited, until after the Judges have awarded the Prizes. All animals shall, if application be made by the Judges, be submitted to the Veterinary Surgeon of the Society for his opinion.
- 7.- Any exhibitor lodging an objection shall do so in writing to the Secretary before five o'clock on the day of the Show at the same time depositing in his hand £15, such objection shall be considered by the Committee at their next Meeting when, in the event of its being ruled to be frivolous, the said sum shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society unless in the opinion of the Committee, the objection was a reasonable and proper one.
- 8.- All Exhibitors must fill up and sign the printed form of entry which must be delivered to the Secretary with the Entrance Fees, on or before Tuesday 10th August, 2011
- 9.- All Entries must be in their places in the Show Yard at least one hour before commencement of judging of their respective Classes and remain until 4 p.m. Exhibitors must provide proper halters or chains for securing their animals. The Show Yard will be open to receive Stock from 7 a.m., Horses in the Gymkhana and Jumping Classes will be admitted up till 1 o'clock.
- 10.- The Horses and other Livestock, will be considered and treated as being in the sole charge and custody of the Exhibitors, during the whole of the Show, and every Exhibitor or his representative must be in charge of the same and be subject to the orders of the Stewards of the respective departments. The Committee will not be responsible for or in respect of any loss, damage, or injury arising from accident or any other cause.
- 11.- In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the Owner/Exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

12.- Exhibitors or their representatives must be in attendance with their animals at the stated time of parade, and shall then follow the instructions of the Stewards. Any Exhibitor or representative failing to comply with these regulations, the owners shall be fined the sum of £5, and in case of Prize Animals all awards will be forfeited.

13.- No Third Prize will be given unless four compete, except where the Judges so award.

14.- Rule 7 shall be varied in the case of Ring Events in that any Exhibitor lodging an objection shall do so in writing to the Secretary within thirty minutes of the close of the event.

15.- In the event of cancellation or postponement of the Show, entry fees will be refunded on receipt of an sae less £1.50 per competitor to cover administrative costs.

HEALTH & SAFETY

16.- The Committee has taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the health, safety and welfare of those attending the Show. Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with health and Safety legislation. In the interest of security please ensure Livestock, Horses, Trailers and Tack are left secure when unattended.

17.- The onus is on every rider who suffers a fall, or anybody who suffers an injury whilst on the showground, to report the fall/injury to the Show Secretary.

Note - ALL RIDDEN CLASSES

All riders must wear a hard hat at all times when mounted.

A skull cap or a hat and safety harness to BSEN1384 or PAS015 Standard must be worn by all competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover.

No jewellery or body piercing to be worn whilst competing.

PLEASE HAVE HORSE PASSPORTS WITH YOU.

LOCAL

Where a special award is given for LOCAL exhibitor .

For the purposes of this Show Local is defined as owned and ridden by person/s residing within the Berkeley Hunt Area. A yellow armband must be worn.

TROPHIES

ALL CHALLENGE CUPS presented at last year's show to be returned to the Secretary not later than 31st July, 2011. A DEPOSIT OF £20 WILL BE REQUIRED FROM ALL NON-MEMBERS TAKING A CUP FROM THE SHOWGROUND, (refunded upon return of Cup as above).

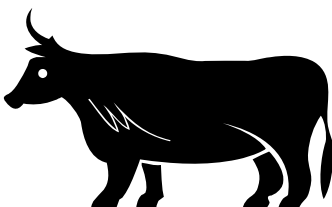

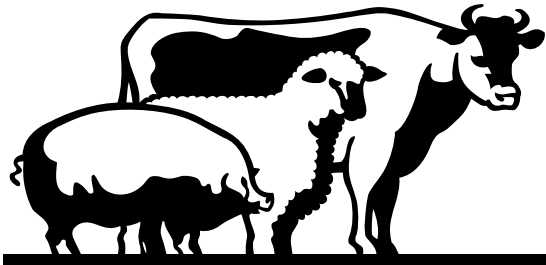

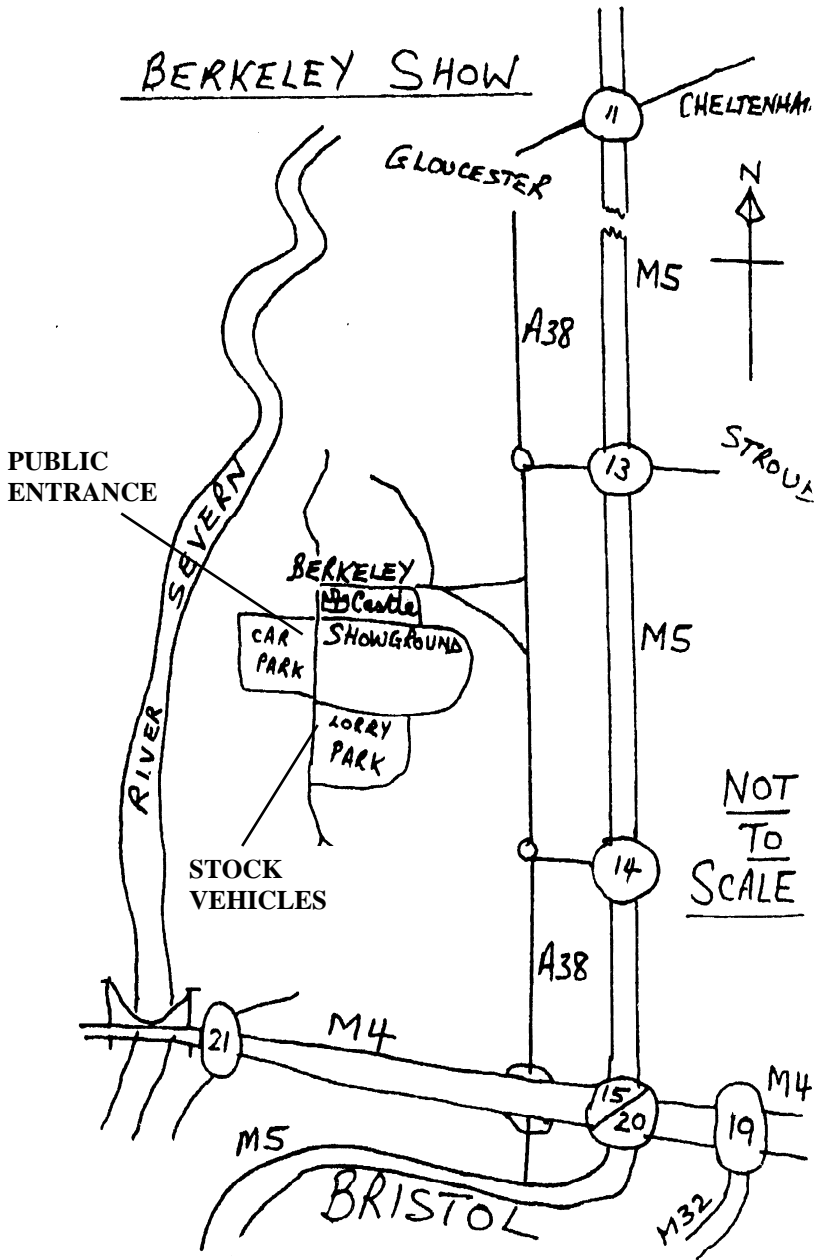
